

## Please Help Us Plan the Future of a Ewing Landmark

Preservation New Jersey and its 1867 Sanctuary Committee cordially invite you to join in a roundtable discussion of future possible uses of the **1867 Sanctuary at Ewing** on Tuesday, **January 8 at 7 pm** at the [Ewing Community and Senior Center](#) at 999 Lower Ferry Road in Ewing. We seek your ideas and suggestions!

Preservation New Jersey currently holds a 50-year lease on the building, and has engaged the architectural firm of Mills + Schnoering Architects, LLC, to undertake an “adaptive reuse” study of the sanctuary at 101 Scotch Road, formerly used by the congregation of the First Presbyterian Church. This study is funded primarily by the Princeton Area Community Foundation with assistance from the New Jersey Historic Trust and from individual donors to Preservation New Jersey's 1867 Sanctuary at Ewing effort. The public phase of the study begins with this session.

Following a presentation by the architectural consultants, interested arts, business and community leaders and other potential users – including YOU - will be invited to share needs and ideas, and to discuss potential uses for the building that will benefit the community. These suggestions and ideas will then be considered in planning and designing interior renovations (lighting, seating, facilities, etc.), seeking to incorporate as many as possible when the 1867 Sanctuary reopens as a community venue. When completed, the resulting design plan will be presented for discussion at a second public meeting.

Private tours of the building are available by appointment. While advance reservations for the discussion are preferred, walk-in guests are welcome.
